'(Co)Happiness Lab' in Kaunas was organised by Vytautas Magnus University from 27 to 29 August 2024. The event attracted 21 students from 9 partner universities. Participants completing all course requirements received a 3 ECTS credit certificate recognised by the entire Transform4Europe Alliance.

The (Co)Happiness Lab summer school was in full swing, with students from the Transform4Europe Alliance embarking on a journey of exploration and discovery of happiness. They were delving into the complex concept of happiness, examining it through the lenses of psychology, philosophy, neuroscience, anthropology, and other disciplines.

Transforming Curricula

We aim to develop joint study programmes at the Bachelor's and Master's levels, involving collaboration between at least two partner institutions. Several workshops have been organised to inform partners about joint programmes that are either already launched or still in development between our universities. These sessions addressed the challenges of cooperation on joint programmes and presented the toolbox developed with T4EU partners, which includes all the necessary resources for setting up joint programmes between our universities.

The goal is to foster better mutual understanding and discuss the implementation of the European degree. We have also organised info sessions to present the outcomes within, including guidelines for implementing seamless vertical mobilities and an approach to micro-credentials.

- designing joint programmes to offer students educational opportunities across T4EU universities with new learning experiences,
- implementing seamless vertical mobilities to enable smooth transitions between partner universities,
- adopting a unified approach to micro-credentials to ensure consistent and common recognition of skills and achievements.

Collaboration on joint programmes

We have created a dedicated team of experts, and several meetings were organised; they were focused on defining shared goals and outlining the methodology. We developed a specialised toolbox to provide a framework for planning, designing, and implementing joint programmes within the T4EU Alliance. It focuses on joint programmes that lead to Joint/Double/Multiple Degrees offered by various higher education institutions and includes information on the European Degree Type of event.

Our 3 workshops gathered 50 participants each, including academic administrators, faculty members, legal advisors, accreditation professionals, and all the participants from academies and faculties of the T4EU Alliance working on the development and management of joint programmes.

BA Tracks

Transform4Europe is proud to announce that 512 students have enrolled in the Bachelor Tracks for the autumn semester 2024/25. With 55 courses offered by six universities, the common course catalogue highlights the strong collaboration within the Alliance. Building on this success, we aim to further develop and expand the catalogue by offering even more courses across six subject areas, providing students with a broader and more enriching learning experience.



Transforming Curricula

KEY TASKS

Creating joint curricula

One of the major goals is to develop joint study programmes at the Bachelor's and Master's levels, fostering collaboration between at least two partner institutions.

Recognition schemes for seamless & vertical mobility

Our goal is to implement the so-called Mobility Windows between partners, aiming to achieve 50% student mobility within the T4EU Alliance. The other goal is fostering vertical mobility, ensuring smooth transitions between study levels across partner institutions. These initiatives aim to ease the transition from one study level to the next, enabling automatic transitions between programmes and establishing rules, and guidelines that promote diversity, complementarity, and bilateral cooperation.

Joint Strategy on Microcredentials

The T4EU Joint Strategy on Microcredentials (MC) outlines the main elements for elaborating T4EU MC offerings. It is to ensure that the joint T4EU Alliance MC courses/programmes are in line with the 10 EU-adopted principles of quality, transparency, relevance, valid assessment, learning pathways, recognition, portable, learner-centred, authentic, information and guidance.

Our Team aims to establish Joint PhD Programmes and the Joint Smart Transformation Ecosystem, as well as achieve research excellence. Innovative researcher training, networking and support lead to creating synergies across disciplines, while research and academic traditions contribute to establishing a modern inter-university campus.

What we do?

A number of instruments are envisaged to facilitate the above, among which are the Joint T4EU Doctoral Support Office, a series of events to foster research matchmaking, building on the existing Transformation Labs and establishing new ones, and a series of bootcamps for novice researchers from the Alliance.

We are perfecting and creating brand new programmes dedicated to PhD students. The T4EU PhD Programmes provide and comprise joint, flexible and innovative doctoral curricula at the doctoral level, while the PhD Tracks are planned to contribute to the variety and flexibility of local PhD Programmes and to increase intra-Alliance mobility.

The first T4EU Bootcamp

The first of the three series of Bootcamps took place in September 2024 in Burgas, Bulgaria.

The Bootcamp was organised by the Smart Cities and Regions Transformation Lab led by Sofia University 'St. Kliment Ohridski'. The Lab also includes the University of Trieste, the University of Primorska, Vytautas Magnus University and the University of Silesia in Katowice.

The Lab focuses on the issues of:

The Lab focuses on:

- regions and cities, the natural and social systems forming their space and structure;
- smart cities and regions, making them more adaptable and transformable to changing geography (climate change and global environmental problems, but also other transformation processes);
- · ecosystem services and nature-based solutions for the cities and regions;
- risks (all kinds of natural, social and economic);
- models for sustainable development.

Doctoral Education and Innovative Ecosystems

The 1st Bootcamp was devoted to sustainable development and environmental transformation, underscoring effective climate adaptation and innovations. It was implemented with the active participation of the Burgas Municipality as a Stakeholder partner. The Bootcamp brought together students and researchers from eight T4EU universities and included workshop activities (the input was provided by academics from Sofia University and Jean Monnet University). The participants had a chance to enjoy a demonstration of advanced data collection tools, including a drone equipped with a LiDAR sensor and a GeoSLAM at the Sea Port Burgas, along with an introduction to biodiversity challenges in the region of Burgas and their potential solutions.

The Stakeholder Challenge was an opportunity for students to propose and discuss in-depth ideas about transforming a specific site around the former city department store, called 'The Hole'. The task aimed to engage students in developing a conceptual plan to transform the derelict urban area in Burgas into a sustainable space. The students combined their knowledge on adapting the site to climate change and enhancing urban sustainability through innovative, nature-based solutions and presented them to a jury of experts. The most valuable and innovative ideas were then shared with the Burgas Municipality, which is a partner and stakeholder of Sofia University in the T4EU project and other joint activities.

First Matchmaking event 'Al and Society'

was organised by Jean Monnet University and attracted a total of 80 participants over 2 days, i.e. 13-14 November 2024. It also featured a dedicated PhD conference, emphasising

the importance of collaborative projects and research within the T4EU Alliance. The activities were designed to facilitate collaboration and networking. Suggestions have been made, and emphasised the need for more interactive and collaborative elements in the activities.

The suggestions included introducing more tasks or group activities to help participants meet each other before the event begins and placing greater emphasis on working together.

The participants recommended having more workshop time where groups can self-organise around specific topics or issues and work collaboratively to solve them, potentially with supervision.


Enhancing the innovative transformation ecosystems

Sustainable and diverse campus

T4EU Monthly Sentences


